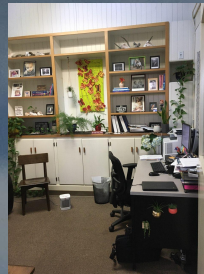
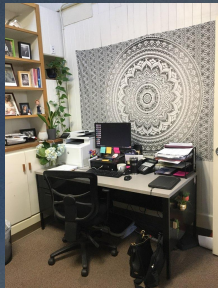




Bethany Williams - School Counselor

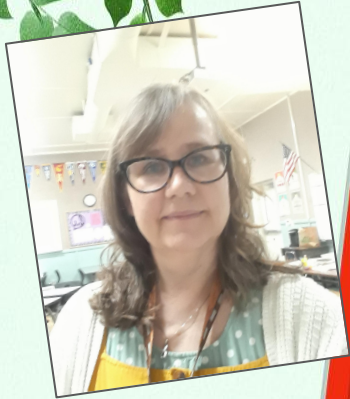

India Greeley - Silver Strong

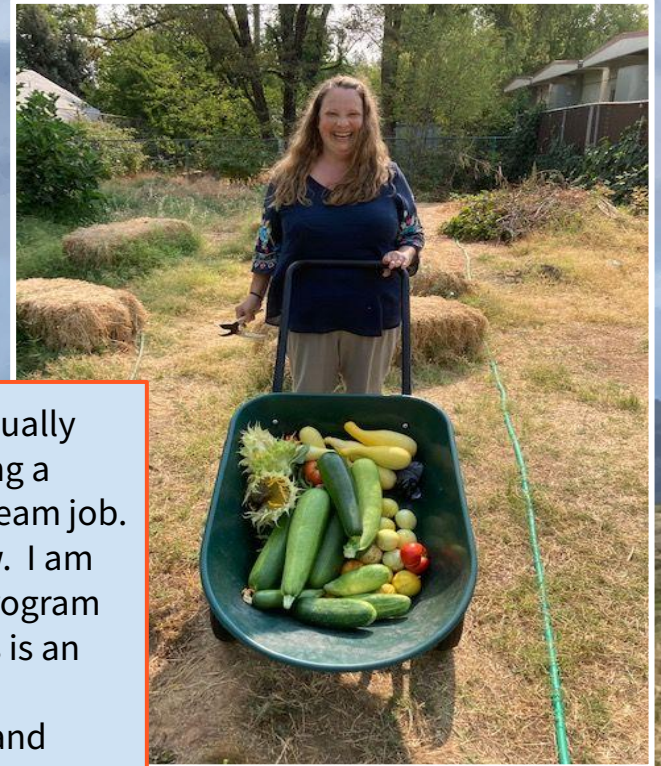

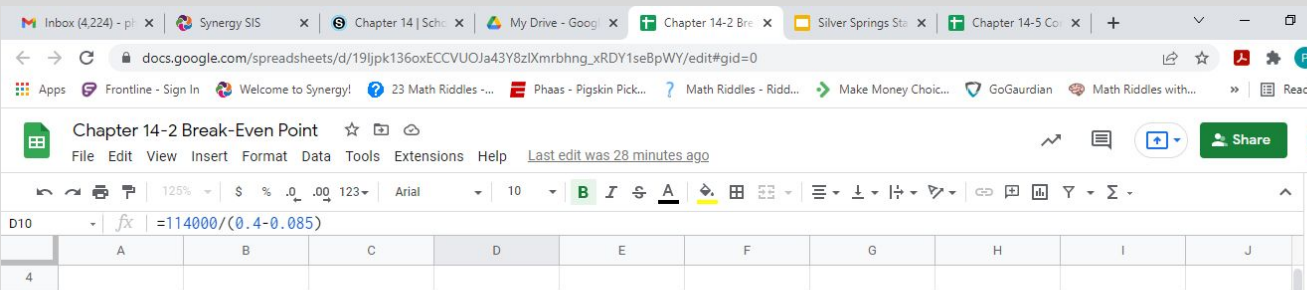


Julie Gregerson Education Specialist (RISE)

A major goal of my math program is the integration of technology to enhance problem solving including the use of spreadsheets as an organizational tool as well as a calculator.



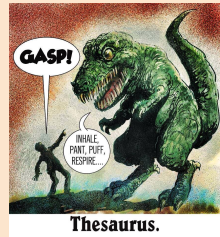
Tamara Haas

I collaborate with our district's other intervention coordinators on district-wide initiatives but feel the crux of my position occurs in my classroom, also called the Learning Center. The Learning Center accepts drop-ins from classes as well as hosts multiple students on its study hall roster.

Students are encouraged to complete work, do free reading, check grades, and pursue other interests in the Learning Center. Students often receive personalized encouragement. Trained in IIRP's Restorative Practices, my goal is to serve as a "warm demander" in all domains of a student's growth, with a focus on their academic achievement.

While there is also a component of On Campus Suspension (OCI) most students come to the Learning Center voluntarily, to complete work or to simply opt into the setting. There is often a social component among students which makes the learning center a pleasant space to visit and work.

Jennifer Thompson - Principal's Secretary

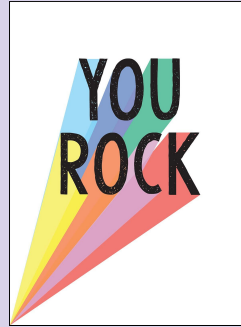

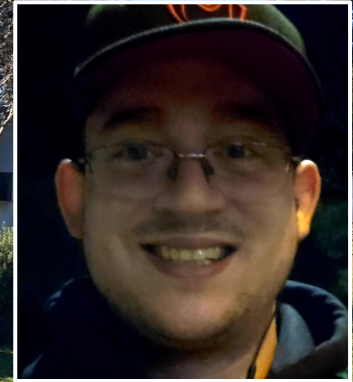
